While the construction of the Town of Onondaga Town Highway Building itself has been completed, there is still additional site work to be done. the spring and early summer final grading, drainage, paving and landscaping will be completed. Later this summer we will

set a date to have an open house so that all of our residents may have the opportunity to visit this new facility. I know that our town Highway employees are very happy with their new building and are anxious to give guided tours to anyone who would like to do so.

While Syracuse winters can be difficult, this year's winter provided its own unique challenges with record breaking cold temperatures, significant snowfall and even heavy rains which caused flooding in some areas of the town. I would like to thank our Highway Superintendent, John Wheatley and all of our town Highway employees for the excellent job they did throughout this past winter as they salted and plowed 100 miles of Town roads and 22 miles of Onondaga County roads. Thank you for making our Town highways safe for travel during adverse conditions.

The town was successful in obtaining Community Development Grants late last year in the sum of \$50,000. These grant monies will be spent for the construction of a new pavilion in Kelley Brothers Memorial Park, Nedrow and for

continuing interior improvements in the Town of Onondaga Senior Center.


The town was also successful, with the assistance of Senator John D. Francisco, in obtaining a state and municipal facilities program (SAM) grant in the amount of \$100,000. That grant will be used later this summer to replace the heating and air conditioning rooftop units at the Town of Onondaga Town Hall. The town has applied for additional grants from Community Development for 2018 and we will continue to look for additional state grants throughout this year.

Earth Day in the Town of Onondaga will be Saturday, April 21st. We are grateful for all those who volunteer to pick up trash along our town highways and streets. You may bring your trash bags to the Town Highway Garage between 8:00 AM and noon on Saturday, April 21st. As they have for many years, Waste Management will again be donating a truck and driver to assist us in making our town a more environmentally friendly community.

July 2, 2018 will mark the 100th anniversary of the explosion at the Split Rock Munitions Plant that supplied TNT for World War I. On that fateful evening 50 people lost their lives and 50 people were injured. Since September of 2017, honor students from OCC have been working with their professor, the Town of Onondaga Historian, the Town Historical Society and the Town Board to focus attention on this event and to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the "Split Rock Disaster". We thank the students at OCC for their efforts in helping us to commemorate this historic event.

U.S. Passports

There has been a slight increase in the US Passport prices. These prices are set by the US Department of State and are the same across the country. Beginning April 2, 2018, the Acceptance Fee will be \$35. Here's a breakdown of the US Passport Fees:

If you would like to apply for your Passport Book or Passport Card, the Town Clerk's Office is the place to go. For traveling across the boarders by car or boat, the Passport Card is sufficient. Any air travel out of the country requires a Passport Book. As in the past, all applicants must appear in person. When applying for a child's passport book or card, it is required that children under the age of 16 have the signatures of both parents. Ages 16 through 18 require one parents signature.

Current processing time is four to six weeks. If you are traveling out of the country in the upcoming months, please try to plan

ahead. The expedite option is still available for an additional \$60 with a return time of two to three weeks. For more information on the requirements for a passport book or a passport card or for an application, you may visit www.travel.state.gov or call the Town Clerk's Office at (315)469-1583.

Solicitors

It's that time of year again when solicitors are out and about and knocking on doors. Please remember to never open your door if someone makes you feel uncomfortable. All individuals soliciting in the Town must first register in the Town Clerk's Office. If someone comes to your door selling or soliciting goods or services, they should have a form with them that is printed on my letterhead with my signature and the Town of Onondaga's raised seal. If they cannot provide this, feel free to tell them that they are required to register in the Town Clerk's Office and ask them to leave. Also, the hours that they are allowed to solicit are Monday through Saturday, between 9 am and 7 pm, never on Sunday's or national holidays.

Dear Tax Payers,


During the next several months, I will be updating the records for the September School collection of taxes. The School tax bills will be mailed the first week in September. If you are responsible for the payment of your own taxes, and do not receive a bill, please notify my office and I will mail you a duplicate bill. Please be aware that it can take up to 2 months for my office to be notified of any changes in new ownership or changed escrow status. If you have recently moved into the Town of Onondaga or are no longer escrowed and are now responsible for paying your own taxes, please notify my office of this change.

If you would like to take advantage of the partial pay-

ment option, please remember that you must make the first partial payment which can be of any amount, in the penalty free period of the bill (the first 30 days) and the remaining balance will have an interest fee added of 2% until the end of October. No delinquent taxes can be owed on the property.



pointed me to two program committees; Public Safety and Planning and Economic Development. I will be serving as a member of the Public Safety committee and I have been appointed as Chairman of the Planning & Economic Development committee.

Several departments and agencies report to the Planning & Economic Development committee; Agriculture Districts, the Economic Development office, the Community Development division, the Information Technology department, the Onondaga County Industrial Development Agency, the Onondaga Civic Development Corporation, the Trust for Cultural Resources, the Greater Syracuse Property Development Corporation (Land Bank), the Syracuse-Onondaga County Planning Agency (SOCPA), the Central New York Regional Planning and Development Board, Visit Syracuse and Cornell Cooperative Extension. Each of these depart-

ments, organizations and agencies plays an important role in the progress our county is making to create jobs, improve our neighborhoods and bring visitors to our region. I look forward to working with each entity to continue to draw people to Central New York.

I will also be serving on two additional outside committees, the Economic Development Advisory Board and the CNY Regional Planning and Development Board. The Economic Development Advisory board was established in 2013 to oversee Economic Development Incentive funds. The members of the advisory board review project applications for economic development funding, based on established criteria, to draw new businesses to Onondaga County and to help existing businesses expand and succeed here. The CNY Regional Planning and Development Board (CNY RPDB) is a public agency serving five counties; Cayuga, Cortland, Madison, Oswego and Onondaga. CNY RPDB provides a range of services associated with growth and development in our communities. They are instrumental in transportation planning, environmental and energy management, community and economic development and land use. This board is responsible for overseeing development, services and management from a regional standpoint.

As Chairman of the Legislature's Planning and Economic Development Committee, it is imperative that I am collaborating with these boards and departments to ensure we are all moving Onondaga County in the right direction. Where does one start? What words can be used to honor Judge J. Craig Kerr that will do justice to thank him for his esteemed and prestigious 40-year career here in the Town of Onondaga?

Judge Kerr started his judgeship in 1977 at the old town hall on West Seneca Turnpike with the rickety steps and haunted upstairs lobby where bats in the belfry and rats in the basement were not unheard of. He started when times were simpler, when crimes committed were fairly basic and referred to in a much kinder way. For example, kids swiping a candy bar from the drug store, driving tipsy after a golf tournament or Christmas party and school pranks that were

a nuisance; however, property was not damaged and weapons were not commonplace AND all paperwork was completed with a pen and submitted by mail!!!

Fast forward 40 years and he leaves having had the opportunity to serve in the beautiful new town hall, with everything happening fast, with technology leading the way, everything done at the push of a button and "in the cloud", electronically & uploaded!!!!

Judge Kerr kept pace and loved every minute of it. It is estimated that he held court over 2000+ times, performed approximately 1000+ wedding ceremonies (even married one gentlemen twice to 2 different brides as he liked Judge Kerr so much). Oh, the stories he can tell......

Thank you, Judge Kerr, for always taking the time with our kids to show them a better way, thank you for always being available to answer questions not only from your Court Clerks but Clerks and Judges from all over the County and beyond. Thank you for being on call for the last 40 years for middle of the night arraignments taking time away from your own family.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Registration is accepted on a first come, first served basis. Non-residents pay \$10.00 more for most programs.

- Registration is online at townofonondagarecreation.com.
- We have a drop box in the rear of the building/office on East Ave. Please do not leave cash.
- Registration deadline (unless otherwise specified) for all programs is one week before the program begins. A late fee of \$10.00 will be added to the program fee when registering after the deadline.
- Don't wait for deadlines. Program may be canceled if minimum not reached.
- It is the intention of the Town that no youth be denied the ability to participate in programs because of an inability to pay. Partial scholarships are available for youth programs to eligible families upon proof of income.
- Parking and entrances on both Velasko Road and East Avenue.
- Now accepting major credit cards. A 2.95% (\$3.00 min.) convenience fee is added to each credit card transaction.
- If paying in person or by mail, please make checks payable to Town of Onondaga. An online account must be created even if you choose not to pay online.

REFUND/CREDIT POLICY

Please use care when selecting classes. A 100% refund will be made when a class is canceled by the Recreation Department. Refunds will be made up to a week before the program begins. A \$5.00 administration fee will be deducted. A \$20.00 fee will be charged for any returned checks.

CANCELLATION POLICY

In the event of a cancelation due to weather or any other unavoidable problem, every effort will be made to contact participants. However, sometimes this is impossible. If you are ever in question as to whether or not a class might be canceled, call the Recreation Office at 315-469-3464.

PARKS

Listed are the four Town parks and a brief description of each facility. Please be aware that dogs are banned from all parks.

Reservations for courts, fields, and pavilions require a permit, available at the Parks & Recreation office, or online at www. townofonondagarecreation.com. The permit - available in both resident and non-resident form, lists all fees and rules. An online account must be created prior to submitting a reservation form to complete the rental process.

KELLEY BROTHERS MEMORIAL PARK

251 DORWIN AVENUE, SYRACUSE, NY 13215

This 15 acre park has youth baseball games and practices most weeknights. The park has a restroom, small pavilion, play areas, tennis court, beach volleyball and grills. The maximum for permits is 75.

KING MEMORIAL PARK 4030 SPLIT ROAD, CAMILLUS, NY 13031

The athletic fields are heavily used by our adult softball leagues during the week, with WOYSA playing games on Saturdays, spring and fall. This 20 acre park has two softball fields, a beach volleyball court, two tennis courts, basketball court, two pickleball courts, grills, pavilion, playground equipment and restrooms. There is a small pavilion near the playground equipment to provide shade and picnic seating for all the families that utilize the play areas on a regular basis. The maximum for permits is 100.

HOWLETT HILL PARK 5051 YOUTH CENTER ROAD, CAMILLUS, NY 13031

Adult softball games are held week nights, along with WOY-SA holding soccer games on Saturdays in the fall. This 9 acre

park has one tennis court, basketball court, covered shelter, grills, a play area including a rock tunnel, and restrooms complete this park. The maximum for permits is 75.

ANTHONY J. SANTARO MEMORIAL PARK 4979 VELASKO ROAD, SYRACUSE, NY 13215

This 22 acre park is a major site for WOYSA, Blue Wave Lacrosse, Westhill and Onondaga Community College athletic teams. Playground pieces for children 2-5 years old, as well as a play piece for older children. The shade shelter, adjacent to the play areas, is for the use of all park participants, providing shade and picnic seating. It is not reserved for groups—only the upper pavilion is available by permit. The park also has tennis courts, a tennis wall and a basketball court. Tikes 'n Bikes Santaro Town provides a safe, fenced in area for in-line skating, and children with big wheel type rider toys, tricycles and small bikes with training wheels. Bike riders and in—line skaters MUST wear protective equipment. Two large grills are adjacent to a large pavilion. The maximum for permits is 150.

PARK SECURITY

Our Town facilities are routinely patrolled by our staff and the Onondaga County Sherriff's Department. If you have an emergency, it is best to call 911.

Vandalism in any park is expensive and senseless. Unfortunately, we have seen a rise in vandalism and a general disregard for the facilities including excessive trash, unsupervised children in restrooms, improper use of park property, etc. Any or all of these things leads to additional time and money spent for repairs or even the sudden cancelling of activities including park permits.

We need your help to keep the Town of Onondaga Parks beautiful. You are urged to call 911 to report any suspicious activity. All reports are anonymous. Park ordinances are strictly enforced with appearance tickets.



In 2017, the South Onondaga Fire Department responded to our community and surrounding community's aid 282 times. We do this with a totally volunteer force of dedicated men and women of varying ages, occupations and schedules. As such, we are always looking for new members. If you ever considered becoming a volunteer fire fighter, please contact one of our members, stop by the fire station any Monday night or like us on Facebook, South Onondaga Fire Department.

Besides having the satisfaction of helping your community,

there are added benefits such as the LOSAP (Length of Service Award Program), where annual contributions are made to a pension like fund. The pension type plan that is available to volunteer firefighters if they meet the minimum level of activity has gone through an extensive review over the past year, culminating in the change to a new administrator and a new investment service. This change, which was approved by all 8 Town departments, was done to get the best returns on the investments of our members as part of the reward for helping to serve their communities. Another available benefit, if you are a college student or aspiring to be one, FASNY (Fireman's Association of the State of New York) offers HELP (Higher Education Learning Plan), where active members can receive tuition cost coverage at any community college in New York State for up to 80 credit hours, regardless of the major of study. Why don't you join us and reap these benefits as a member of the South Onondaga Fire Department.

We are looking forward to the delivery of a new heavy Rescue truck this Spring which will replace our current truck of 28 years. The current Rescue truck has undergone several refurbishments and as such is in need of replacement. The new Rescue truck will conform with current OSHA mandates and will improve our response time to better serve our communities. It is with your continued support that has made this acquisition possible.

We would like to replace our display/message sign located along Makyes Road with an LED-lighted sign that could be used to post


multiple messages but have been informed by the Town that current zoning laws won't permit this type of replacement. If this is a change you would like to see, we would like to hear from you.

The Historian's Corner

Natalie A. Williams-Dardaris, Town of Onondaga Historian

The date of July 2, 1918 stands alone from others in the Town of Onondaga's over 200-year history as it marks the day Split Rock exploded. The site of a munitions manufacturing plant, in support of WWI America and its' efforts in Europe, was the scene of an intense explosion that was experienced by the community from downtown Syracuse to Navarino and lots of other places in between. This "Year of the Rock – 2018" will be commemorated with a number of events throughout our community. The Town of Onondaga Historical Society will feature a speaker series focused on the topic of Split Rock. We have also been honored to have the efforts and research of TOHS member Richard Miller culminate in a four volume series of books, all based on Split Rock, which are available at the TOHS Museum.

To stay up to date with what is happening at the museum and with the Town's Historical Society, there is now a Facebook page for the Town of Onondaga Historical Society. Events are posted and there are links to our current podcasts on Split Rock and to two recent articles also on Split Rock featured in the Eagle Newspapers' Prime Living Magazine. A big thank you to Andy Dolloff, OCS instrumental music teacher, who has provided us with his

expertise in getting our podcasts up and running.

Split Rock history benefited from the creative efforts of Professor Laurel Saiz OCC English Honors Seminar from the Fall 2017 semester. The students created a Friends of Split Rock Facebook , which is a great resource for those who would like to learn more about Split Rock as well as the explosion. Another class creation was the drama "Split Rock: Stories from the 1918 Explosion" which will be presented in collaboration with the Onondaga Historical Association. Presentation of this work will take place on May 2, at 11:15 AM and 7 PM at Storer Auditorium on the OCC Campus, featuring performances of college actors and actors from the community as they portray people who experienced the tragedy.

For your reading enjoyment, the museum now has available the book "Legacy of an Immigrant Farmer", written by Town of Onondaga native Mary Luchsinger Sperling.

A former teacher at Onondaga Central, Mary decided to spend some of her retirement time writing about her farm family, from her grandfather's arrival in this country through the good times and the struggles of being a farm family, Those who know the Luchsinger family will recognize many other longtime community residents in her story. Mary's book is available at the TOHS Museum. Hours are Monday through Friday, 1 to 3 PM, 5020 Ball Road.

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
