Dear Fellow Residents,

This year the federal government will be conducting the 2020 Census. Between March 12th and March 20th, the US Census Bureau will have sent you an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census either online, by phone or by mail. If you do not respond either online, by phone, or by completing the written questionnaire by the first week of May, employees of the US Census Bureau will be going door to door from May 13th to July 31st to obtain your information. Your response is important as the population and other statistical information gathered are used to determine the number of seats each state holds in the US House of Representatives and in the distribution of federal funds allocated to states and local municipalities.

Over the past few weeks, a number of Town residents have asked me about the number and age of the Town of Onondaga snowplows. I want to assure our Town residents that the Town of Onondaga Highway Department has an adequate number and age appropriate fleet of vehicles to provide safe and efficient snowplowing operations for our Town residents. Over 20 years ago, under my leadership, the Town Board working with our Highway Superintendent initiated a Town Highway Vehicle Replacement Program to assure that our fleet was adequate and age appropriate to keep our Town roads plowed and salted during our Syracuse winter weather. Currently the Town Highway Department has eleven snowplows. The oldest snowplow is a 2005 model and the newest is a 2020 model. During a snowstorm ten snowplows are used to clear our Town of Onondaga highways. If a plow breaks down during a storm the extra plow, the 2005 model, is put into service while repairs are made to the other vehicle. Once winter is over the snowplows are removed from the eleven vehicles and they are repurposed for use in all of other Highway functions performed from spring through fall. The Town has purchased five new snowplows since 2014 and our plan calls for another new snowplow to be purchased next year to replace the oldest snowplow in our current fleet. All of this has been done and will continue to be done while maintaining debt free Highway Department and General Fund budgets.

In November 2019, our Town Board passed the 2020 Town Budget. Not only did we not exceed the 2% property tax cap but we were able to reduce the combined Town Highway and General Fund tax rate from \$2.55 per thousand to \$2.52 per thousand. I am also pleased to report that again at the end of last year Moody's Investors Services recognized the sound fiscal management and strong financial position of the Town of Onondaga and reaffirmed the Town's Aa2 credit rating. In its report Moody's stated: "The credit position for Onondaga is very strong. The notable credit factors include a strong financial position as well as low debt and pension liabilities. The debt burden of Onondaga is very low and is a credit strength with respect to its Aa2 rating."

Earlier this year, in an effort to reduce cost and provide more efficient services to our residents, the Town has eliminated the position of Dog Control Officer and has contracted with the Central NY Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (CNYSPCA) to respond to and enforce all New York State laws and Town of Onondaga ordinances pertaining to dogs within the boundaries of our Town. If you need to report a concern or issue about a dog you should contact the CNYSPCA @ 315-454-0928. After hours you should call 911 and they will contact CNYSPCA to respond to you. Contact information for the CNYSPCA is also on our Town website.

As we move into Spring and warmer weather, here are some important items we'd like to share with you:

The 2020 Census and Confidentiality

Here's a bit of information from the US Census Bureau:

- The US Constitution mandates a census of the population every 10 years. Census statistics help determine the number of seats each state holds in the US House of Representatives and how billions of dollars in federal funds are allocated to state and local communities for the next 10 years.
- By now you will have received your initial invitation from the 2020 US Census to respond online or by phone. Reminder letters will continue up until April 27th. If a household does not respond to any of these mailings, a census taker will follow up in person between May 13 and July 31.
- Responding to the 2020 Census helps communities get the funding they need and helps businesses make datadriven decisions that grow the economy. Census data impacts our daily lives, informing important decisions about funding for services and infrastructure in our community, including health care, senior centers, jobs, political representation, roads, schools, and businesses. More than \$675 billion in federal funding flows back to states in local communities each year based on census data.
- Your responses to the 2020 Census are safe, secure and protected by federal law. Your answers can only be used to produce statistics they cannot be used against you in any way. By law, all responses to US Census Bureau household and business surveys are kept completely confidential.

Happy Spring to everyone, this year's mild winter was a very nice change from last year. We are currently sweeping the Town roads, and doing drainage work throughout the Town in preparation for our summer road repairs. We will also be picking up brush and yard waste throughout the summer months, please remember we can only pick up paper bags with lawn waste, NO PLASTIC OR TRASH OF ANY KIND, NO DIRT OR ROCKS IN BAGS. We would also like to remind everyone that brush pickup will end for the season at the end of October, after that you will need to take your yard waste and brush to OCCRA as the highway department will be preparing for the upcoming winter.

The Town will be participating in Earth Day Clean-up again this year which will be Saturday April 25, 2020 from 9am to noon at the highway garage. From the Receiver of Taxes...

Dear Taxpayers,

During the next several months, I will be updating the records for the September School collection of taxes. The School tax bills will be mailed the first week in September. If you are responsible for the payment of your own taxes, and do not receive a bill, please notify my office and I will mail you a duplicate bill. It can take up to 2 months for my office to be notified of any changes in new ownership or a change in escrow status. If you have recently moved into the Town of Onondaga or are no longer escrowed and are now responsible for paying your own taxes, please notify my office of this change.

If you would like to take advantage of the partial payment option, please remember that you must make the first partial payment which can be of any amount, in the penalty free period of the bill (the first 30 days) and the remaining balance will have an interest fee added of 2% until the end of October. No delinquent taxes can be owed on the property.

Town of Onondaga Residents,

Thank you, to the residents of the Town of Onondaga for your overwhelming support this past November in my re-election bid for a second term representing the 11th District on the Onondaga County Legislature. It has been a privilege and honor of a lifetime to serve and strive for the betterment of the community where we all work, live and raise our families.

As we start a New Year, allow me to highlight a few of our County's past accomplishments. We ended 2019 spending \$16 million less than previously and we are currently projecting a \$3 million budget surplus. This surplus brings the county's fund balance to \$73.3 million which is \$7 million more than the 10% fund balance goal.

The 2020 County budget is in balance with an historic low tax rate of \$5.00 per thousand. In addition, we refinanced \$25 million in bonds at a true interest rate of 1.43%, which will allow us to save the hard-working taxpayers \$3.2 million over the next ten years.

At our last legislative session, I co-sponsored and the legislature passed and sent a resolution to our New York State representatives imploring them to amend the new Bail Reform law. We asked them to think through the unintended consequences of this law before we experience an unimaginable tragedy here in our community. We also passed a resolution during our budget process asking New York State to provide additional funding for this entirely unfunded mandate that was placed on the County.

Lastly, I would like to mention the renewed energy, coordination, and teamwork displayed throughout Onondaga County government. Our newly elected County Executive, Ryan McMahon, has a vision for Onondaga County that I feel is noble. It is a vision that we all can get behind and support enthusiastically. With a focus on tackling poverty, building up our infrastructure, and improving on the economic resurgence taking hold in our region, Onondaga County, and the residents of the town of Onondaga, have a lot to look forward to as we start a new decade.

Spring @ Your Library

This spring, OFL is kicking off a 6-month reading and discussion series, *Votes for Women*. In 2020, our nation celebrates 100 years of the 19th Amendment, Women's Suffrage. The history of the women's suffrage movement in our state and nation spanned 70 years and includes many overlooked stories. The book selections in this series – a combination of history, biography and fiction – provide a window into this chapter of American social progress and a springboard into ongoing discussions of women's – and by extension, our society's – past, present and future. Books are available for checkout each month at the library and registration is required for each book discussion. This series will conclude with field trip to the Women's Rights National Historical Park located in Seneca Falls (sponsored by the Friends of OFL) on Saturday, August 1st. Funded by a Humanities New York grant, this discussion series will be facilitated by Sarah Stegeman, a PhD candidate at Syracuse University, specializing in African American Women's History. REGISTRATION IS ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS.

- Non-residents pay \$10.00 more for most programs.
- Registration is online at townofonondagarecreation.com.
- We have a drop box in the rear of the building/office on East Ave. Please do not leave cash.
- Registration deadline (unless otherwise specified) for all programs is one week before the program begins. A late fee of \$10.00 will be added to the program fee when registering after the deadline.
- Don't wait for deadlines. Program may be canceled if minimum not reached.
- It is the intention of the Town that no youth be denied the ability to participate in programs because of an inability to pay. Partial scholarships are available for youth programs to eligible families upon proof of income.
- Parking and entrances on both Velasko Road and East Avenue.
- Now accepting major credit cards. A 2.65% (\$3.00 min.) convenience fee is added to each credit card transaction. **This fee is non-refundable**, even if the program is cancelled by the department.
- If paying in person or by mail, please make checks payable to Town of Onondaga. An online account must be created even if you choose not to pay online.

Refunds or account credit will be made up to a week before the program begins. Credit will be added to your account in full, but a \$5.00 administration fee will be deducted for refunds. A \$20.00 fee will be charged for any returned checks.

CANCELLATION POLICY

• In the event of a cancellation due to weather or any other unavoidable problem, every effort will be made to contact participants. However, sometimes this is impossible. If you are ever in question as to whether or not a class might be canceled, call the Recreation Office at 315-469-3464.

Listed are the four Town parks and a brief description of each facility. Please be aware that dogs are banned from all parks. Parks will be closed November through April. Although all parks have restrooms, they are only open when there is a permit, or when we have a program held at that site. Otherwise, the bathrooms will be closed. Reservations for courts, fields, and pavilions require a permit, available at the Parks & Recreation office, or online at *townofonondagarecreation.com*. The permit form found online or in our office, lists all fees and rules. An online account must be created prior to submitting a reservation form to complete the rental process.

Kelley Brothers Memorial Park - 251 Dorwin Avenue, Syracuse, NY 13205

This 15-acre park a new, rentable pavilion with an accessible walkway leading up to it. The park also has a restroom, play areas, tennis court, beach volleyball and grills. There is a small pavilion near the playground equipment to provide shade and picnic seating for all the families that utilize the play areas. The maximum occupancy for permits is 75.

King Memorial Park - 4030 Split Road, Camillus, NY 13031

The athletic fields are used by our adult softball leagues during the week, with WOYSA playing games on Saturdays, spring and fall. This 20-acre park has two softball fields, a beach volleyball court, two tennis courts, basketball court, two pickleball courts, grills, pavilions, playground equipment and restrooms. There is a small pavilion near the playground equipment to provide shade and picnic seating for all the families that utilize the play areas. The maximum occupancy for permits is 100.

Howlett Hill Park - 5051 Youth Center Road, Camillus, NY 13031

Adult softball games are held week nights, along with WOYSA holding soccer games on Saturdays in the fall. This 9-acre park has one tennis court, basketball court, pavilion, grills, a play area, and restrooms complete this park. The maximum occupancy for permits is 75.

Anthony J. Santaro Memorial Park - 4979 Velasko Road, Syracuse, NY 13215

This 22-acre park is a major site for WOYSA, Blue Wave Lacrosse, Westhill and Onondaga Community College athletic teams. Playground pieces for children 2-5 years old, as well as a play piece for older children. The shade shelter, adjacent to the play areas, is for the use of all park participants, providing shade and picnic seating. It is not reserved for groups–only the upper pavilion is available by permit. Two large grills are adjacent to the upper pavilion. The park also has tennis courts, a tennis wall and a basketball court. Tikes 'n Bikes Santaro Town provides a safe, fenced in area for in-line skating, and children with big wheel type rider toys, tricycles and small bikes with training wheels. The maximum occupancy for permits is 150.

PARK SECURITY

Our Town facilities are routinely patrolled by our staff and the Onondaga County Sheriff's Department. If you have an emergency, it is best to call 911. Vandalism in any park is expensive and senseless. Unfortunately, we have seen a rise in vandalism and a general disregard for the facilities including excessive trash, unsupervised children in restrooms, improper use of park property, etc. Any or all of these things leads to additional time and money spent on repairs or even the sudden cancelling of activities including park permits. We need your help to keep the Town of Onondaga Parks beautiful. You are urged to call 911 to report any suspicious activity. All reports are anonymous. Park ordinances are strictly enforced with appearance tickets.

Your Town of Onondaga Historical Society continues its high level of activity uncovering and preserving the oral and written history of the people and events which directed and defined our evolution over these past two hundred -plus years.

We hope that many of you were able to visit our museum last Fall to observe and appreciate the broad collection of Onondaga artwork and cultural artifacts in our showcases. Most items were on loan from Alfie Jacques, the internationally known, third generation wood craftsman and maker of traditional

Lacrosse sticks. The remainder of the exhibit came from the collections of Richard Giarrusso and Richard Houser. We are planning for more Onondaga materials exhibits in the future. We are accepting donations of Onondaga Nation arts, crafts and cultural artifacts to be assembled into a more permanent display at the museum. We shall revisit the Onondaga Culture and their Confederacy in the future, after we explore the many additional themes that attract our members and community.

The Historical Society maintains a modest, but well-conceived and appointed museum at our Town Hall. We benefit from a group of dedicated volunteers who serve a docents Monday through Fridays, 1:00PM to 3:00 PM throughout the year. Please stop into the museum to review our exhibits, study our library collection or simply discuss local history with our volunteers. Our collection of photographs, maps, family histories, cemetery locations and County Poor House Records and more are sure to capture your interest and attention. Remember, your family legacy MAY BEGIN WITH YOU! Think about preserving the history of your family; if you don't do it who shall?

In the next few months, we shall develop an exhibit of antique tools in our museum display cases. Paul Ferenchak MD, a member of our Historical Society, is helping us organize and display examples of the primitive tools used by our local craftsmen in building our village and town. Dr. Ferenchak has restored antique houses and barns, disassembled and moved old buildings and taught himself to use his antique tools in his restoration work. In addition to his tools, perhaps Paul will honor us with some demonstrations of his primitive carpentry skills before the year is out.

One of our Trustees, Tony Baleno, has a deep personal interest in the old barns in our town. He has initiated an effort to photograph and record the history of as many of these critical structures as possible. Many fall victim to the heavy snows of Central New York every year. Tony is actively collecting related information, so please contact him if you have interest in this project or have a barn deserving of documentation.

Please share the good stories of our historical society and museum with your neighbors and friends, especially with people new to the town. Engagement with the TOHS is a great way to introduce yourself and your family to our historic community. Hope to see you at one of our functions soon.
