I would like to thank all of our Town residents who attended the Open House of our new Town Highway building last Fall. The feedback was very positive. The children had a great time sitting in the big trucks. Everyone enjoyed the guided tours, appreciated the opportunity to walk through the facility to see all of the equipment and learn the many responsibilities of our Highway employees other than plowing and paving roads. Thank you to all who helped make this a successful event.

In November 2018, our Town Board passed the 2019 Town Budget. Not only did the Town not exceed the 2% property tax cap, but we were able to reduce the combined Town Highway and General Fund tax rate from \$2.56 per thousand to \$2.55 per thousand. While New York State continues to impose unfunded mandates and decrease revenues to local towns and municipalities we continue to seek grant monies, Community Development funding and any other sources of revenue that might assist us in reducing your local Town taxes. I will continue my efforts to provide cost effective government services for the benefit of all of our Town residents and taxpayers.

Our application for \$50,000 in Community Development funding for 2019 has been approved. Twenty-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$27,500) will be used in Kelley Brothers Memorial Park in Nedrow to improve handicapped accessibility and repave driveway and parking areas. In addition, we will purchase park benches and make landscaping improvements. Twenty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$22,500) of the grant will be used for the construction and installation of supplemental heating units, new energy efficient LED lighting fixtures and other upgrades to the interior of the Town of Onondaga Senior Center. We have already made application for additional Community Development funding for 2020. We are attempting to secure \$150,000 for the improvement of water lines in our Nedrow community.

On Saturday, April 27th the Town of Onondaga will participate in Earth Day. We hope that our Town residents will be able to volunteer their time to pick up trash along the Town highways and streets and bring their trash bags to the Town Highway Building between 8:00 AM and 12:00 PM on Saturday, April 27th. We thank Waste Management for again donating a truck and driver to assist us in making our Town a cleaner and more environmentally friendly community.

As I'm writing this article, the Central New York weather continues its rollercoaster ride of single digits one day and into the forty's the next. While we haven't had as much snow as usual, we certainly have had our fair share of freezing rain and ice. As we move into Spring and warmer weather, here's what's going on in the Clerk's Office:

US Passports

The Town Clerk's Office continues to be an Acceptance Facility for US Passports. Even during the federal government shutdowns, the US Department of State continued to process passports, and the timeframe remains at four to six weeks for normal processing and two to three weeks for expedited processing. Feel free to contact my office with any questions you might have.

If you are looking for the passport application on-line, it's very important that you only visit the <u>www.travel.state.gov</u> website. Some people have gone to other websites (i.e. www.passportusa.org) and have paid a fee to simply complete the application. You should never be paying a fee to complete the application. If you do not have access to a computer and printer, applications are available at the Town Clerk's Office. Please call **315-469-1583** with any questions or concerns.

It's important to remember to verify the expiration dates of everyone that is traveling. If a child was under the age of 16 when they received their passport, their passport was only valid for five years vs. an adult's passport which is good for ten years. In addition, the US Department of State strongly recommends that the passport has a validity of at least six months beyond the travel dates. To check travel advisories, travelers' checklists, and to enroll in STEP (Smart Traveler Enrollment Program), please be sure to visit **www.travel.state.gov.**

As you know, it is a NYS Law that your dogs are licensed with the municipality where you live. In order to purchase a dog license, your dog must have a current rabies vaccination. <u>Marriage Licenses</u>

Springtime is when many couples begin to make their marriage arrangements. A couple getting married in New York State (excluding NYC) can purchase their marriage license at any Town or City Clerk's Office. The Marriage License becomes valid 24 hours after it is purchased, and it is good for 60 days. All couples must appear in person, and both parties need to bring photo ID, birth certificates, and divorce decrees or death certificates for all previous marriages. The fee for the license is \$40. Dear Taxpayers,

It has been a long winter and I know most of you are looking forward to the Spring like weather, myself included. During the next several months I will be updating the records for the September school collection of taxes. Due to the many agencies involved, it can take up to 2 months to be notified of any changes in ownership or escrow status. If you have recently moved into the Town of Onondaga or are no longer escrowed and are now responsible for paying your own taxes, please notify my office of this change.

If you would like to take advantage of the partial payment option, please remember that you must make the first partial payment which can be of any amount, in the penalty free period of the bill (the first 30 days) and the remaining balance will have an interest fee added of 2% until the end of October. No delinquent taxes can be owed on the property.

A lot was accomplished in the Onondaga County Legislature in 2018. A few surprises near the end of the year have segued into a very exciting and energized 2019 and there is a lot for Town of Onondaga residents to look forward to. In 2018, the Onondaga County Legislature continued to invest in our 'Loop the Lake Trail' securing a \$1.5 million grant from the federal government to extend the trail another 2.3 miles. This brings the total trail to approximately 10 miles looping the lake. Another \$1 million grant from the Dormitory Authority will be used to provide lighting along the trail near the amphitheater. This has been a major project for the County and one that the Legislature is committed to seeing through. The Legislature has also worked with the City of Syracuse to incorporate green infrastructure into their road reconstruction projects. This is important to the County in order for us to reach the mandated storm water capture goals while saving us money on construction costs.

To round out some of the other accomplishments in 2018, the County Legislature is continuing its investment in our roads, bridges, parks, county facilities and sewer infrastructure. We sought additional funding from the state for snow plow services based on the severity factor of the previous three winters and we received \$4.9 million. This money was shared with the towns that are plowing county roads. The County Legislature also adopted the operating budget for Onondaga Community College. The total local, county share equals \$9,872,000 of that budget. We all know the importance of higher education and Onondaga Community College has proven to be a valuable and important education center for the county. Lastly, I would like to mention the renewed energy, coordination, and teamwork being displayed throughout Onondaga County government. Our new County Executive and former fellow colleague in the Legislature, Ryan McMahon, has a vision for Onondaga County that I feel is a noble cause and one we all can get behind and support vigorously. With a focus on tackling poverty, building up our infrastructure, and improving on the economic development taking hold in our region, Onondaga County, and the residents of the town of Onondaga have a lot to look forward to in the near future.

John McBride represents the 11th district in the Onondaga County Legislature which includes the Town of Onondaga and portions of the Town of Camillus. For those of you who are unfamiliar with our justice court system, each town and most villages north of New York City have a justice court. Justice courts handle many matters such as small claims and landlord/tenant disputes, but most of the caseload is criminal and traffic. In that regard, a major legislative change has taken effect as of October of last year. The legislation is referred to as Raise the Age. It will affect all city, town and village courts.

Effective October 1, 2018, the age of criminal responsibility in New York State will be raised from 16 years of age to 17 years of age. As such, any felony offenses or non-Vehicle and Traffic Law misdemeanors, such as DWI's, committed on or after October 1, 2018 by persons who have not attained their 17th birthday by such date will no longer be prosecuted in the local criminal courts.

Any 16-year-old defendants who are charged with a felony will be called Adolescent Offenders. Adolescent Offenders will be prosecuted in the newly created Youth Parts of the County Court, which will be staffed by specially trained Family Court Judges. Juvenile Offenders, defined as defendants who are 13,14 or 15 years of age, charged with committing certain violent felonies, will also be arraigned and prosecuted in the Youth Part. Accordingly, our Town Court will lose jurisdiction over cases involving Adolescent Offenders, except that our two Town Judges will still conduct arraignments of Adolescent and Juvenile Offenders during the hours when the Youth Part is not in session, meaning the evenings. We will still be "on call" during off hours or when we help to staff the newly created Central Arraignment Part in Syracuse.

Any misdemeanor offense committed by 16-year-old persons are designated as Juvenile Delinquent offenses and will be prosecuted in the Family Court, including arraignments. However, the Town of Onondaga Justice Court still has jurisdiction to arraign and hear Vehicle and Traffic Law misdemeanors such as DWI's.

As a side note, all these young defendants, if detained, are held here in the Town of Onondaga at the Hillbrook Detention Center.

A final note, effective October 1, 2019, the Raise the Age legislation applies to any defendant who is less than 18 years old at the time of the commission of the offense.

The Friends of Onondaga Free Library closed 2018 on a high note! The Election Day Bake Sale was a success- more than 20 bakers helped the Friends to raise \$550. The 12th annual Festival of Trees brought joy to library visitors and \$1,500 to OFL. The Friends thank all who participated in these fundraisers: bakers, tree decorators and donors. The Annual Membership Campaign has raised \$5,000. Thanks to all our Friends- new and old!

With these very successful fundraisers, the Friends have been able to make significant contributions to OFL. They funded the purchase of 2 charging stations- each with the capability of charging up to 10 devices at a time, including wireless charging. The Friends also funded a new collection at OFL- the Library of Things! This collection consists of 9 technology devices that you may want to try before you buy, including a Google Home Mini, an Amazon Echo Dot, an android tablet, a Kindle Paperwhite, a GoPro, a FitBit, a Chromecast, a Roku and a Bluetooth FM transmitter. Also, part of the Library of Things collection, the Friends funded the purchase of 8 Empire Passes- these passes provide free parking and access to most New York State parks. The passes are available for checkout year-round at OFL. Registration is accepted on a first come, first served basis. Non-residents pay \$10.00 more for most programs.

- Registration is online at townofonondagarecreation.com.
- We have a drop box in the rear of the building/office on East Ave. Please do not leave cash.
- Registration deadline (unless otherwise specified) for all programs is one week before the program begins. A late fee of \$10.00 will be added to the program fee when registering after the deadline.
- Don't wait for deadlines. Program may be canceled if minimum not reached.
- It is the intention of the Town that no youth be denied the ability to participate in programs because of an inability to pay. Partial scholarships are available for youth programs to eligible families upon proof of income.
- Parking and entrances on both Velasko Road and East Avenue.
- Now accepting major credit cards. A 2.65% (\$3.00 min.) convenience fee is added to each credit card transaction.
- If paying in person or by mail, please make checks payable to Town of Onondaga. An online account must be created even if you choose not to pay online.

REFUND/CREDIT POLICY

• Please use care when selecting classes. A 100% refund will be made when a class is canceled by the Recreation Department. Refunds or account credit will be made up to a week before the program begins. Credit will be added to your account in full, but a \$5.00 administration fee will be deducted for refunds. Listed are the four Town parks and a brief description of each facility. Please be aware that dogs are banned from all parks. Parks will be closed November through April. Reservations for courts, fields, and pavilions require a permit, available at the Parks & Recreation office, or online at

townofonondagarecreation.com. The permit form found online or in our office, lists all fees and rules. An online account must be created prior to submitting a reservation form to complete the rental process.

Kelley Brothers Memorial Park - 251 Dorwin Avenue, Syracuse, NY 13205

This 15 acre park has youth baseball games and practices most weeknights. A new pavilion has been added, along with an accessible walkway to the new structure. The park also has a restroom, play areas, tennis court, beach volleyball and grills. There is a small pavilion near the playground equipment to provide shade and picnic seating for all the families that utilize the play areas on a regular basis. The maximum occupancy for permits is 75.

King Memorial Park - 4030 Split Road, Camillus, NY 13031

The athletic fields are heavily used by our adult softball leagues during the week, with WOYSA playing games on Saturdays, spring and fall. This 20 acre park has two softball fields, a beach volleyball court, two tennis courts, basketball court, two pickleball courts, grills, pavilion, playground equipment and restrooms. There is a small pavilion near the playground equipment to provide shade and picnic seating for all the families that utilize the play areas on a regular basis. The maximum occupancy for permits is 100.

Howlett Hill Park - 5051 Youth Center Road, Camillus, NY 13031

Adult softball games are held week nights, along with WOYSA holding soccer games on Saturdays in the fall. This 9 acre park has one tennis court, basketball court, covered shelter, grills, a play area including a rock tunnel, and restrooms complete this park. The maximum occupancy for permits is 75.

Anthony J. Santaro Memorial Park - 4979 Velasko Road, Syracuse, NY 13215

This 22 acre park is a major site for WOYSA, Blue Wave Lacrosse, Westhill and Onondaga Community College athletic teams. Playground pieces for children 2-5 years old, as well as a play piece for older children. The shade shelter, adjacent to the play areas, is for the use of all park participants, providing shade and picnic seating. It is not reserved for groups—only the upper pavilion is available by permit. The park also has tennis courts, a tennis wall and a basketball court. Tikes 'n Bikes Santaro Town provides a safe, fenced in area for inline skating, and children with big wheel type rider toys, tricycles and small bikes with training wheels. Bike riders and in—line skaters MUST wear protective equipment. Two large grills are adjacent to a large pavilion. The maximum occupancy for permits is 150.

PARK SECURITY

Our Town facilities are routinely patrolled by our staff and the Onondaga County Sherriff's Department. If you have an emergency, it is best to call 911. Vandalism in any park is expensive and senseless. Unfortunately, we have seen a rise in vandalism and a general disregard for the facilities including excessive trash, unsupervised children in restrooms, improper use of park property, etc. Any or all of these things leads to additional time and money spent on repairs or even the sudden cancelling of activities including park permits. We need your help to keep the Town of Onondaga Parks beautiful. You are urged to call 911 to report any suspicious activity. All reports are anonymous. Park ordinances are strictly enforced with appearance tickets.

The Historian's Corner

This issue the Town Historian turns to long time town resident and TOHS Trustee Tony Baleno as he recalls the days of an egg farm in Cedarvale...



THE BUCKLEY EGG FARM OPERATION

Located in the heart of Cedarvale was a commercial Egg Farm owned and operated by Mr. and Mrs. C. A. Buckley. The address of the farm was 4014 Amber Rd. next door to the general store. The laying hens were housed in a two-story 20' x 50' chicken coop located on the southeastern side of the property with south facing windows on the southern exposure. The coop had running water and electricity on both floors and outdoor fenced chicken runs on the northern exposure of the building to allow the chickens access to the outdoors.

The Cedarvale Rd side of the home, adjacent to the chicken coop, had a large summer kitchen addition where the eggs were prepared for sale to customers. It is said that the Buckley's had someone who delivered the eggs to customers on a motor route in the general area.

When rehabilitating the house back in the late 1960's, we found a Farm Bureau sign in the area where the eggs were prepared for sale. This sign, dated 1946, indicates that the egg farm and the Buckley's were members of the Onondaga County Farm Bureau. This sign has been donated to the TOHS museum.

No other information was found regarding when the farm was started or when it stopped operating, although it had to have operated for some time to have grown to a 2000 square foot chicken coop and processing area.

When the property was purchased, the coop was inspected, and it was determined that it had been allowed to exist for too long a period without a solid roof and there was far too much water damage and rot on the second-floor structure making it unfeasible to repair or restore that level. Several years later, during the winter months, the second level was torn off, revealing that the original one-story structure was still underneath with its own roof which may have protected it from rot.

The original shed style roof of the original coop was leveled with studding and joists to create the second level's floor, and the second floor was constructed on that deck. Never having removed the roofing from the first-floor roof deck left this roof in repairable condition once the second-floor walls and flooring were removed. The space between the lower floor and upper floor was a form of blind attic that served no known special purpose.

As a part of the salvage project, the remaining first floor area was enlarged on the northwest side to accommodate a twobay garage, and the roof was raised the following summer to create a full loft above the garage space. This section was extended on the side of the building to create enough depth to house vehicles and mowing equipment. The structure's original first floor shed roof chicken coop areas were converted to an adjoining workshop area (approx 20' x 20') on the Cedarvale Rd end and a small storage area (approx 10' x 20') on the Amber Rd end. As of this writing, there is an addition that has been added by the current owner to the Amber Rd end for boat storage.

It was unfortunate that the roof on the structure was not repaired and was allowed to leak and destroy the upper structure. This is an all too common occurrence for large, unused structures such as barns and storage buildings. A good roof could have saved the structure. While this story details only what has been passed to me by old neighbors and friends, there must be more to the history of this farm out there in people's memories or desk drawers. Anyone who remembers any details about this history, or has any photos, should feel free to contact me at **tbaleno@gmail.com**. South Onondaga Fire Department

The South Onondaga Fire Department recently accepted delivery of a new Heavy Rescue truck, replacing our 1990 Rescue truck. Our new Rescue 1 is a Spartan truck chassis, with a body built by Emergency Vehicles Incorporated and purchased through Har-Rob Fire Apparatus. The new truck features a 450 horse power diesel engine to expedite our response time, a recessed vertical light tower to improve scene lighting and a fully enclosed forward cab that will seat 6 firefighters plus an officer and driver. Thanks for your support over the years that made this purchase possible.

As we are constantly looking for ways to keep our operating costs down, this year our fire station has upgraded its lighting to all LED lights inside and out which will save tremendously on our electricity cost. This was possible through a program sponsored by National Grid.

Thanks to a \$15,000.00 grant award by Firehouse Subs, our department purchased a new washing machine and dryer to launder our turnout gear. The cleaning of our turnout gear is very important to our members safety as it has been determined that the residues from firefighting on turnout gear is a significant contributing cause of cancer in firefighters.

The department responded to 313 alarms in 2018, and are constantly looking for new members. We provide the training to start you off on an exciting and rewarding way to serve your community.
