Provides legal services to residents of Onondaga County age 60+. Services cover the following civil areas:
Consumer Matters such as problems with collection/debt; Living Wills, Power of Attorney Preparation, and Revocation, Simple Will & Testament, Health Care Proxies; Legal problems concerning Food Stamps, HEAP, Social Security, SSI, Veterans Benefits; Medicaid/Medicare disputes; Public Assistance and Utility issues. Legal Council is available throughout the year. Appointments last approximately ½ hour for a single person, and up to 1 hour for a couple.
Their services are free but 'voluntary contributions to the


delicious cookies, or
