#### Dear Fellow Residents,

It's been a busy nine months since I started as Town Supervisor. Along with the hardworking, community-minded members of the Town Board, we are excited about the progress made to support local business, improve the environment, upgrade infrastructure, manage your tax dollars effectively and implement quality of life improvements for and communication with residents. We will always strive to meet and exceed your expectations to continually move our great town forward.

#### Here are some of the things we want to be sure you are aware of:

#### **Quality of Life**

- The new playground at Kelley Park opened this summer and families in the area are making great use of it.
- We secured community development funds through the county for new baseball fields at Santaro Park and construction will start pending environmental review studies. Tennis and pickleball courts are complete!
- The 2022 Parade of Homes is set for October 13 23 in the now-in-progress Old Town Estates neighborhood, located on Onondaga Hill off Cleveland Rd. This will be the seventh Parade event held in our town.
- The town has condemned and continues to pursue teardown of the former Lafayette Country Club, which is a blight to our community. We are embroiled in a legal battle with the owner but want to ensure residents that this is a top priority.
- We are making recruitment support for our amazing volunteer fire departments a priority for the long-term and will work closely with them throughout the fall and winter to put tangible programs in place.

#### Infrastructure

- Several businesses along South Salina St. in Nedrow have begun or completed improvements to their facilities and properties after receiving town-allotted grants for upgrades. The businesses include ECK Tree & Outdoor Power/Ferris Mowers, Colonial Laundromat, EJ's Auto, Central New York Glass Block and Green Hills Farms.
- The switchover to LED street lighting is nearing completion across the town. LEDs save energy, money, cause less hazardous and non-hazardous waste, require less maintenance, and can improve safety by providing greater visibility.
- Our Town Highway Department is to be commended for the fast response and outstanding clean-up following the microburst that devastated many businesses and homes both north and south of Route 175 this past July.
- The town is participating in the Community Solar subscription agreement, which provides solar credits on our utility bill, thereby reducing total electricity expenses. There are no associated fees. We simply agree to receive solar credits from our allocated share of a solar farm. For information on how this innovative cost-saving program works, go to energy.gov/eere/solar/community-solar-basics.

#### Communication

- IT updates have been completed at all town buildings to improve cybersecurity, resident and employee safety, and operational efficiencies. Also, many services can now be accessed online by residents via our new highly interactive website at townofonondaga.gov. Likewise, our Facebook page (@townofonondaga) has proven to be a great place to share information about what is going on in our town, reaching, on average, 12.2K people a month. Do not hesitate to submit your stories, news and event announcements to our FB admin.
- We are in the exploration stage of a community-wide messaging service to share urgent information with residents re. utility service interruptions, road/traffic updates, missing person/public threats/dangerous wildlife and severe weather.

#### Dear Fellow Residents,

I hope you have all been enjoying this beautiful summer! Our office has been very active in fulfilling the many services we offer to our residents. If you've had the opportunity to stop in for any of them, I hope it was a positive experience! Here are a few things that you might be interested in.

#### **Conservation Licenses**

By now, many of you will have already received your Hunting Licenses and Deer Management Permits (DMP) for this year's season. As in the past, the sale of DMPs ends at the close of business on October 1st (Friday, September 30th our office). It is helpful if you review the Deer Management Unit Map to determine where you will want your permit issued, prior to getting your license. Please visit www.dec.ny.gov for all of the latest hunting and fishing information and regulations.

#### **Handicapped Parking Permits**

You can obtain your handicapped hang-tags/parking permits at our office as long as you have completed the application required by New York State. Applications can be obtained from your doctor's office or here at the Town Clerk's office. You will need to have the form completed and signed by you and your doctor, and you will also need to provide your driver's license, or a state-issued ID when applying. You must also be a resident of the Town of Onondaga.

#### **Veterans Return the Favor Cards**

An honorably discharged military Veteran residing in Onondaga County can get their FAVOR card by bringing their discharge papers or DD-214, along with photo ID to the Town Clerk's office. FAVOR cards qualify you for discounts throughout Onondaga County. For a list of participating merchants, stop into the Town Clerk's office or visit ongov.net/favor. It's one small way to show our appreciation to our many Veterans throughout our community!

#### **Dog Licensing**

You may have received a letter or a phone call from our office regarding your dog's license renewal. Our goal is to have all of our records as up to date as possible. If you have received a call or a letter, please provide our office with updated rabies information, so we can continue to maintain accurate records of the dogs in our community. You can license your dog for up to three years at a time – depending on when the vaccine expires. Having your dog licensed has also proven to be a great tool in reconnecting lost dogs with their owners!

#### U.S. Passports (Appointment Required)

The Onondaga Town Clerk's Office continues to be a great place to submit your passport application. Application processing times are 8 - 10 weeks for routine service and five-seven weeks for expedited service. It is imperative that you plan ahead for any travel you plan outside of the United States. If there is a life-or-death emergency in the applicant's immediate family that require them to travel outside the United States, a passport can be received within 72 hours (3 business days). An appointment for emergency passport service can be made by calling 1(877)487-2778.



As a reminder, the REAL ID full enforcement date is fast approaching! **Beginning May 3, 2023**, every air traveler 18 years of age and older will need a REAL ID-compliant driver's license or identification card, state-issued enhanced driver's license, or another TSA-acceptable form of identification at airport security checkpoints for domestic travel.

#### **Additional Information**

As we continue to move forward, we do ask that you call 315-469-1583 to make an appointment for a passport, marriage license, or any lengthy notary service. We hope that by doing this, it will prevent too many people waiting together at one time and will create a better experience for everyone.

# From the Receiver of Taxes

#### Dear Neighbors,

It's back to school time and that means ... school tax collection. Bills will be mailed around August 30 and due without penalty by September 30. Deputy Tax Receiver, Annie Owens, and I hope to make it as painless as possible through efficient processing, assistance with your questions and service with a smile - and a kiss (Hershey's, that is).

#### Following is this year's penalty schedule:

- September 1 30: No penalty
- October 1 31: 2% fee
- November 1 15: 5% fee (*Payments must be made to Onondaga County.*)
- After November 15: Outstanding balances are added to the 2023 property tax bill.

As has been the case for the past two years, no cash is accepted. Payments by check or money order can be mailed to or made in-person at Town Hall (5020 Ball Rd.). Credit cards and e-checks are accepted online at ongov.net/etax.

#### A couple of quick reminders:

- Our office does not provide tax estimates. See Through NY however offers a handy tax calculator at: seethroughny.net/benchmarking/property-tax-calculator.
- Any questions regarding exemptions, including STAR, Enhanced STAR, veteran, senior citizen, agricultural or any other, can be made to our Assessor at ssarsfield@townofonondaga.gov or 315.469.3216.

#### EXAMPLES OF ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Sofas, chairs, box springs, washers, dryers, toys, scrap wood, plumbing fixtures, lawn furniture, grills, carpeting, dry empty paint cans without lid.
- Brush: MUST be piled separately from junk and will be picked up with your scheduled Fall Cleanup. Branches must be 6 inches in diameter or less and no more than 8 feet in length. Please stack neatly away from fences, power poles and low wires.
- Leaves & Yard Waste: MUST be in paper leaf bags or cardboard boxes. No plastic bags will be picked up, as they are not biodegradable and cannot be composted. No stones, dirt or trash of any kind in bags please.

### Town of Onondaga Residents,

The past few months have been busy at the Onondaga County Legislature, as Legislators including myself pushed forward several important resolutions which will bring big benefits to the people of the 11<sup>th</sup> District and our whole county. We approved \$15 million dollars to help improve broadband service in rural areas and a Senior Household Stimulus Program which will soon provide more than 27,000 seniors with \$200 checks.

Perhaps I'm most excited about the money I secured to help with flooding relief in the Town of Onondaga. The resolution I sponsored allowed for \$100,000 in hazard flood relief for county municipalities and I'm proud to say it passed with bipartisan support. The Town is getting a portion of that to help with repairs and changes to Hogsback Road, where many of you will remember we had serious flooding and road damage following severe storms in 2021. Among the work that was done: the building of a large retaining wall structure below the eastern shoulder of the failed roadway, and the construction of a sub-surface drainage collection system and a new 36-inch diameter HDPE storm culvert. This work will hopefully eliminate future flooding issues at this location. The county money I secured will help the Town of Onondaga cover the high cost of this much-needed project, and so I'm glad I was able to help make it available.

District 11 residents are saving at the gas pump, thanks to a gas tax cap the Legislature approved earlier this year. The cap limits the county sales tax on gasoline purchases through November 30<sup>th</sup>. With the cap in place, sales tax won't be charged on any amount over \$3, regardless of how high the price of gas rises. The savings may seem small each time you fill up, but over time, that money adds up and has already saved drivers – myself included – significant amounts. It's a great way not just to help everyday drivers, but our local businesses with vehicles on the roads.

We are lucky to have Onondaga Community College in our district, and this institution of higher learning has taken itself so much higher in the last 9 years under the leadership of President Dr. Casey Crabill. She retired earlier this year and it was my distinct pleasure to honor her with a Gold Seal – the County Legislature's highest honor. I wish her well in retirement and I now look forward to working with her replacement, Dr. Warren Hilton.

Everything I do at the Onondaga County Legislature is about you – the residents and business owners of the 11<sup>th</sup> District. It's so important to me to find ways to help you, especially during these difficult days when prices of almost everything have risen. As always, I am thankful for your support and will continue to do all I can for our district. It really is an honor for me to be your Onondaga County Legislator.

# **Onondaga County Legislator and Town of Onondaga work together to repair flooding damage and to prevent future flooding from occurring**

One highly-used road in the Town of Onondaga has seen its fair share of significant and destructive flooding, but recent construction work hopes to stop it from happening again.

The work on Hogsback Road – which was closed in 2021 following severe storms that washed out part of the roadway - was completed with the help of county money secured by Onondaga County Legislator John McBride.

At the time of the flooding, Thomas Andino was the Supervisor for the Town of Onondaga.

"I contacted our County Legislator, John McBride, and alerted him about the situation on Hogsback" recalls Andino. "He visited the site to assess the damage sustained and made a commitment that he would work to secure funding from Onondaga County to assist the Town for our unbudgeted expenses incurred to repair Hogsback Road."

That's exactly what Legislator McBride did.

"The resolution I sponsored allowed for \$100,000 in hazard flood relief for county municipalities and I'm proud to say it passed with bipartisan support" says McBride, whose 11<sup>th</sup> District includes the Town.

Current Town of Onondaga Supervisor John Mahar says they were able to secure \$30,000 of that money for the Hogsback Road project. That's a third of the overall cost, but Mahar says it helps subsidize the burden to the Town.

"Although this is somewhat of a remote road, its closure was quite troublesome and a safety hazard to the homes and families affected" he says.

Among the work that was done: the building of a large retaining wall structure below the eastern shoulder of the failed roadway, and the construction of a sub-surface drainage collection system and a new 36-inch diameter HDPE storm culvert.

"It was an excellent collaboration between Legislator McBride, the town engineer, and the highway superintendent to put together a plan to not only repair the washed-out road but make sure it would not happen again" adds Mahar. "The final product is outstanding. I thank Legislator McBride for his efforts in bringing this project to completion."

"This work will hopefully eliminate future flooding issues at this location" says Legislator McBride. "The county money I secured helps not just the Town of Onondaga cover the high cost of this much-needed project, but it helps the residents of Hogsback Road feel more confident serious flooding won't occur there again. So, I'm glad I was able to help make this funding available."

Andino adds, "Our residents and I were very thankful to Legislator McBride for his efforts in securing these funds."

#### **REGISTRATION IS ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS.**

- Non-residents pay \$10.00 more for most programs.
- Registration is online at townofonondagarecreation.com.
- We have a drop box in the rear of the building/office on East Ave. Please do not leave cash.
- Registration deadline (unless otherwise specified) for all programs is one week before the program begins. A late fee of \$10.00 will be added to the program fee when registering after the deadline.
- Don't wait for deadlines. Program may be canceled if minimum not reached.
- It is the intention of the Town that no youth be denied the ability to participate in programs because of an inability to pay. Partial scholarships are available for youth programs to eligible families.
- Parking and entrances on both Velasko Road and East Avenue.
- Now accepting major credit cards. A 2.65% (\$3.00 min.) convenience fee is added to each credit card transaction. **This fee is non-refundable**, even if the program is cancelled by the department.
- If paying in person or by mail, please make checks payable to Town of Onondaga. An online account must be created even if you choose not to pay online.

# **Refund & Cancellation Policies**

#### **REFUND/CREDIT POLICY**

• Please use care when selecting classes. A 100% refund (excluding the convenience fee for registration when using a charge card) will be made when a class is canceled by the Recreation Department. Listed are the four Town parks and a brief description of each facility. Please be aware that dogs are banned from all parks. Parks will be closed November through April. Although all parks have restrooms, they are only open when there is a permit, or when we have a program running on site. Otherwise, bathrooms will be closed. Groups of 15 or more MUST have a permit. Reservations for courts, fields, and pavilions require a permit, available at the Parks & Recreation office, or online at *townofonondagarecreation.com*. The permit form found online or in our office, lists all fees and rules. An online account must be created prior to submitting a reservation request to complete the rental process.

#### Kelley Brothers Memorial Park - 251 Dorwin Avenue, Syracuse, NY 13205

This 15-acre park has a new, rentable pavilion with an accessible walkway and grills nearby. The Park also has playground areas, a tennis court, beach volleyball court, and a basketball court. There is a small pavilion near the playground equipment to provide shade and picnic seating for all the families that utilize the play areas on a regular basis. The maximum occupancy for permits is 75.

#### King Memorial Park - 4030 Split Road, Camillus, NY 13031

The athletic fields are heavily used by our adult softball leagues during the week in the summer, with WOYSA playing games on Saturdays, spring and fall. This 20-acre park has two softball fields, a beach volleyball court, two tennis courts, basketball court, two pickleball courts, grills, a pavilion, playground equipment and restrooms. There is a small pavilion near the playground equipment to provide shade and picnic seating for all the families that utilize the play areas on a regular basis. If you are a R.C. car enthusiast, check out our new course by the basketball courts! The maximum occupancy for permits is 100.

#### Howlett Hill Park - 5051 Youth Center Road, Camillus, NY 13031

Adult softball games are held week nights in the summer, along with WOYSA holding soccer games on Saturdays in the fall. This 9-acre park has two softball fields, one tennis court, a basketball court, a pavilion, grills, playground equipment, and restrooms. The maximum occupancy for permits is 75.

#### Anthony J. Santaro Memorial Park - 4979 Velasko Road, Syracuse, NY 13215

This 22-acre park is a major site for WOYSA, Blue Wave Lacrosse, and Westhill High School athletic teams. Playground pieces for children 2-5 years old, as well as a play piece for older children. The shade shelter, adjacent to the play areas, is for the use of all park participants, providing shade and picnic seating. It is not reserved for groups–only the upper pavilion is available by permit. Two large grills are adjacent to the large pavilion. The Park also has tennis courts, new pickleball courts, a tennis wall and a basketball court. Tikes 'n Bikes Santaro Town provides a safe, fenced in area for in-line skating, and children with big wheel type rider toys, tricycles and small bikes with training wheels. The maximum occupancy for permits is 150.

### PARK SECURITY

Our Town facilities are routinely patrolled by our staff and the Onondaga County Sheriff's Department. If you have an emergency, it is best to call 911. Vandalism in any park is expensive and senseless. Unfortunately, we have seen a rise in vandalism and a general disregard for the facilities including excessive trash, unsupervised children in restrooms, improper use of park property, etc. Any or all of these things leads to additional time and money spent on repairs or even the sudden cancelling of activities including park permits. We need your help to keep the Town of Onondaga Parks beautiful. You are urged to call 911 to report any suspicious activity. All reports are anonymous. Park ordinances are strictly enforced with appearance tickets.





The Town of Onondaga 1855 NYS Census has been completely indexed. This represents a unique opportunity to discover any ancestors living in our town 167 years ago and this census, as of now and for unknown reasons, is not available on the Ancestry or Family Search sites. The census is divided into 3 Election Districts; No. 1 covers what was then Onondaga Castle (Nedrow today), Sentinel Heights, Onondaga Valley before it became part of Syracuse, and the part of Syracuse known as Brighton and Danforth before joining the city, No. 2 covers the village of Onondaga Hill, Loomis Hill, Howlett Hill and Split Rock areas, and No. 3 covers South Onondaga, Navarino, Cedarvale and the rural areas outside of Onondaga Hill. ### <u>Town of Onondaga Historical Society (TOHS)</u> President's Report

Although the spectrum of educational activities and practices of TOHS has been attenuated by the COVID pandemic in the last 2.5 years, the society itself remains strong and vibrant. Thankfully, our membership base has remained stable, and our Officers and Board of Trustees continue to conduct business electronically. Select individuals have continued to work, alone or in small groups on projects related to our new strategic plan. Fortunately, we finished our strategic plan, coordinated by Peter Wiezalis, just before the pandemic interrupted our personal and professional lives.

One of the major recommendations of the strategic plan was a transition to more computer-mediated learning. The pandemic has taught all of us that personal computers can and will become the bridges to self-directed learning among children and adults, so they will become an important part of our future.

Another timely occurrence, complementary of our strategic plan, was the redesign and development of all computer -related technology in the Town Hall. We have been invited by the Town Fathers and Mothers to partner our fiscal resources with those of our town. The result being a much larger and stronger system capable of doing the kind of activities and programs deemed valuable by our patrons. So COVID has had some positive effects on our Society and town government.

We have struggled to open our museum in the Town Hall on Ball Road, mixed results. Most currently we are following a three-day schedule, Tuesday to Thursday, 1:00PM -3:00PM. These open days are dependent on the availability of volunteer docents. Call the museum for special appoints with staff members or hours of operation.

All our museum volunteers are members of TOHS. We always have work undone, so we always welcome new members and new project volunteers. (Digitizing 180 years of County Poor House records are just one of our many challenges.) If you are not a member of our not-for-profit corporation, please consider joining AND becoming a project volunteer. Formal orientation of volunteer docents is available upon request. As you might anticipate, moving from a paper and pencil organization to computer- mediated systems, we shall have much conversion work to do. Please consider volunteering a few hours a month to help us digitize our collection of documents, photographs, texts, and other ephemera.

If any of you have experience with computer -mediated genealogical research, please consider volunteering for this area. Our Town Historian, Natalie Dardaris -Williams, is the only person assisting the public with genealogy at this point. I promise that we shall respect your personal and professional schedules relative to volunteer projects.
